"We received many letters of support for the Idaho Parks & Recreation grant application to replace the crumbling **City Park Boat Ramp**. Besides replacing the boat ramp, the potential grant will also provide for a pedestrian pathway alongside the ramp to a staging area, and stairway down to the boat ramp from the parking lot. The grant application went in the end of January and we'll find out if we're successful in a few months.

Housing is a hot topic recently. The City Council has reached out to land owners, developers, and our economic development groups to try and find a solution. The City Council welcomes any comments or ideas on the issue."

"MOST BROADBAND UNSERVED AREA IN THE STATE"

City officials recently received an update from CEDA (Clearwater Economic Development Association) which the City is a member of. CEDA submitted a grant application on behalf of Idaho County to secure funds to evaluate the feasibility study of constructing a fiber link between Grangeville and New Meadows. The study would provide critical information needed for regional and state partners to assess project challenges, opportunities, and estimated costs.

The project area (Grangeville to New Meadows) has been identified by the Governors' Idaho Broadband Task Force as being the most broadband unserved area in the state.

Completion of a fiber link would create the only intrastate broadband connection running north to south through the state – currently all telecommunications go out of state, adding miles, time and cost.
