### FIRE PREVENTION WEEK October 2 – 8

- Make sure your home escape plan meets the needs of all your family members.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home; smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.
- Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows open easily.
- Have an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.
  - Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. Practice at least once during the day and at night.

#### PUBLIC WORKS CREW - START APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

Our three Public Works guys (Trenton, Eric and Shane) have started the Idaho Rural Water Association Apprenticeship Program. This is a huge commitment on their part to receive the training necessary to get their operator license.

Why Apprenticeship? Many citizens and community leaders do not realize the time, knowledge and commitment needed to obtain the proper licensing to ensure our communities have access to clean, safe drinking water. It takes years of on the job experience as well as education to obtain the proper knowledge and licensure to properly operate a drinking water or wastewater utility. In addition, recent advancements in water treatment and supply technology have increased the skills and training needed to protect public health and the environment. The combination of on the job training and classroom education make the registered apprenticeship program an excellent fit for our industry.

We were also awarded a grant to purchase 2 TVs for our station. The larger TV was put in our classroom and the smaller is in our bay. The TV in the bay is connected to our Dispatch system so our responders can review maps and call details as they arrive to the station for response. The map details and call info will automatically show when our Dispatch Center assigns us to a call.
