& DISPOSAL SYSTEM.

This is a simple, safe medication disposal system that prevents drug abuse by permanently deactivating pills, patches, liquids, and creams right at home. Central District Health has provided these pouches to the public.

Simply place medications in the carbon-filled pouch; fill halfway with water; wait 30 seconds; seal, shake and dispose of the pouch in your normal household trash. This approach is safe, discrete and environmentally friendly.

Information, and pouches, are now available at the Salmon River Public Library.


Scott brought this machine with him after retiring from his department in California. We really appreciate his service and helping us get what we need to keep our firefighters safe and healthy.
