the Idaho Bureau of Occupational Licenses.



PARKING REGULATIONS – ORDINANCE 142

It's UNLAWFUL to:

- ✓ Park any kind of trailer, motor home, storage trailer, semi-truck, or logging trucks for more than 24 hours on curbed city streets or public parking areas.
- ✓ Park any vehicle on public streets or alleys that is not mechanically operable, or does not have a current valid registration with license plates attached.
- ✓ Park any vehicle on a curbed street or public parking area to display such vehicle for sale.




CITY PARK BOAT RAMP GRANT AWARDED:

We're pleased to announce that Idaho Parks & Recreation Waterways Improvement Fund has approved funding in the amount of \$308,500 to improve the road at the City Park Boat Ramp. The road will be paved to improve drainage and reduce erosion. In addition, a metal stair structure from the parking lot down to the boat ramp will be installed to improve pedestrian access and safety.

This will be the 3rd grant the City has received to improve the boat ramp site. The new boat ramp is quite an improvement!

NEW TOOL IN SERVICE

As a result of the First Responders Bash fundraiser in March, we were able to purchase a TNT Storm Surge battery powered EXTRICATION SPREADER!

The general public has referred to these types of tools as the "Jaws of Life" over the years and up until a few years ago these tools required large and heavy hydraulic power units, hydraulic hoses and 2-3 people just to get one tool up and running. With the technology in today's extrication service, this particular brand operates by a Milwaukee 18V battery and is all self-contained in one unit. What does that mean for us? It only takes ONE person to operate and get the job done

more efficiently and effectively!
This TNT tool will last us for many years to come and we know it will better serve us and the patients we need to cut out of vehicles.
Next year we plan to purchase the TNT Ram to make a complete set of TNT battery powered tools. We have a space on our vehicle saved for the ram already!
