LOCAL OPTION TAX ORDINANCE 220

For those who may be considering starting a business in Riggins, please be aware of the following Local Option Tax requirements:

2% on LODGING RENTALS

2% on PREPARED MEALS

2% on ALCOHOL BY THE DRINK

1% on all other TAXABLE RETAIL SALES

Ordinance 220 is available on the City website, or at City Hall. An application is required to be filed with the City.
